



**Join us as we walk through the streets of Manhattan, passing by some key nonviolence landmarks of our city, stopping to reflect, do a ceremony, sing a song, or listen to an inspiring reading. By walking we are publicly expressing our belief in nonviolence as the only way out of these confusing times.**

**WHEN: Sunday, April 8th from 9:30 AM to 5:30 PM**

WHERE: 12 miles through Manhattan, beginning at Battery Park (at the East Coast Memorial) facing the Statue of Liberty, and ending at Riverside Church, site of Martin Luther King, Jr.'s 1967 "Beyond Vietnam" speech.

WHY: 50 years ago, on April 4, 1968, King was killed by an assassin's bullet in Memphis. We walk to honor his memory, and that of the many individuals, peoples and movements before and after him to have embraced nonviolence, not only as an organizing strategy but as a foundational moral principle for life.
